[ABBOTT, Anthony]. Letter to Anthony Abbott on the mixing and use of paint colours.

"A detailed list of instructions on the mixing and use of colors in painting, written in a letter addressed to Anthony Abbott, Esq., 54 Spencer Street, Northampton Square [London], by an unidentified author. It has the indented date stamp of Oc[t] 4, 1838. The letter names 19 colours, each with a paragraph explaining their composition and practical uses: e.g. Cologne Earth "gives sobriety without coldness to the various tints which are laid over it"; Gamboge "to be used in trees and grass, & to make greys & neutral tints when mixed with Lakes & Indigo..." The instructions are most probably from a drawing master to his pupil."

AFASON, Jos. Drawing Master. 16th March, 1844 - Exeter & Plymouth Gazette.

ALDRIDGE, Edward Westfield. (1739-1813).

In 1777 he was advertising an 'Academy for Drawing in all its Various Branches, viz. Heads, Figures, Landskips, Flowers, &c, in Chalks, India Ink, or Water-Colours..' from 37 Bury Street, St James's. Myrone, Martin. *A Biographical Dictionary of*

ALEXANDER, William. 1802-08 drawing master at the Junior Department of the Royal Military College at Marlow.

BM records a self-portrait. 1897,0813.2

Before William Alexander, (1767-1816), enrolled at the Royal Academy Schools in 1784 he was apprenticed to the landscape artist Julius Caesar Ibbetson. He was a close friend of Dr Thomas Monro and was thus in regular contact with the landscape artists of his circle, including Thomas Hearne and Thomas Girtin, whose sketching club he joined in 1799. Joseph Farington helped him to obtain the post of drawing master at the Royal Military College at Great Marlow from 1802. Henry Edridge drew Alexander's portrait as one of his series that included the portraits of Burney and Stothard (BM 1867.0413,528 and 1867.0413,531). In June 1808, William Alexander was appointed the first Keeper of the Print Room in the British Museum, responsible for showing the prints and drawings to visitors one day a week and for listing the contents of the portfolios containing the collection.

ANDREW, Lucy. Drawing teacher, Brompton, London, wife of Frederick William Andrew, (1822-1903), artistic restorer. [British Picture Restorers].

ANDREWS, Jeremiah. 1730's apprenticed to Mr Stotherd, Schoolmaster, near St James's Square, then on to Portsmouth Naval Academy.

ARCHER. Marriage of Mr. Archer, drawing master, to Miss Summers, both of Colchester. 16th August 1820 - Bury & Norwich Post.

ATKINSON, John Augustus. 1773, exhibited at Free Society of Artists where he described himself as Drawing Master, Newington Butts.

ATWOOD, John. advertised a drawing book of landscapes, by J. Atwood, Junior, Painter of Bentinck Street, Soho (Daily Advertiser, 23 June, 1755). 1763 advertised himself as a drawing master (see Thomas Mortimer's *Universal Directory for 1763*). D

AUSTIN, William.

Although spanning almost a century up until recently surprisingly little has been known about the life of William Austin (1721-1820). He was a pupil of George Bickham the Younger, and also of Francis Vivares, and by 1758 he was in partnership with John Vandergucht. The following year Alexander Cozens' announced in his Essay to Facilitate... that specimens of his next publication could be seen at Mr

Austin's, printseller, in George-Street. An advertisement of 1768 in the Department of Prints and Drawings at the BM lists over 330 of the pupils he had attended.

BACK, William H. Drawing Master. Royal Mathematical School. 26th Feb 1833 - London Courier

BALDRY, Joshua. Drawing Master of Hatfield Wood Side, Herts, and formerly Cambridge, where he established his fame an artist.

26th Dec 1828 - Stamford Mercury.

BALL, Edward. Master of the Church the Saviour School, Birmingham. c1860's.

BALME, John. Drawing Master. Marriage to Elisabeth, youngest daughter of the late Mr. John Gill, manufacturer, of that place. [Huddersfield]. 28th May 1831 - Leeds Patriot.

BARBER, David,. (1795-1848)

He was listed as a drawing master in 1833. Myrone, Martin. *A Biographical Dictionary of Royal Academy Students 1769-1830.* Walpole Society. 2022.

BARBER, Joseph. Trade card of Joseph Barber, drawing master, text in pedestal with statue above; a woman and three cherubs drawing below, one of the cherubs serving as the model. Etching and engraving, printed in brown. 83mm x 117mm. Lettered with production detail: "Jos. Barber invt". c1770-1811.

Joseph Barber (1757-1811) was an English landscape painter and art teacher, and an early member of the Birmingham School of landscape painters. Born in Newcastle upon Tyne, Barber moved to Birmingham in the 1770s, where he worked painting papier-mâché and japanned goods. In 1798, Barber was appointed to teach drawing at the Free Grammar School on New Street holding classes in his studio on the corner of Edmund Street and Newhall Street. By the mid-1790's he was well established as the town's first drawing master, with an academy training artists on Great Charles Street. His pupils there included David Cox, William Radclyffe and Samuel Lines, who was to form his own academy in Newhall Street in 1807.

Joseph Barber in 1795 advertised himself as a painter and drawing master, Great Charles Street, Birmingham in the Universal British Directory.

BARKER, Benjamin. (1776–1838), drawing master. One of his pupils was Henry Venn Lansdown (1806-1860), who resided in Bath.

BARLOW, R. 1792- advertised himself as a drawing master who teaches all arts, in the Norwich Mercury, 7th January.

BARNES, J[oseph]. Coventry drawing-master. c1815.

BARNEY, Joseph, 1753-1832. For more than 30 years he was drawing master at the Royal Military Academy, in Woolwich.. He also taught at one time in Wolverhampton.

BARRALET, John James. (c.1747–1815), artist and drawing master.

He was born in Dublin, son of a huguenot émigré. He was known to have at least two brothers, one of whom, John Melchior (c.1750–c.1787), also became an artist, practising mainly in London. Barralet received his artistic training at two of the Dublin Society's drawing schools, where he studied under Robert Lucius West and James Mannin Having completed his studies, he worked as an artist in Dublin, becoming known as a gifted drawing teacher. He later moved to London, though the exact date of his departure for London is uncertain – dates alternating between 1766 and 1770, when his name appears among the signatories of the 'Rolls of declaration' supporting the Incorporated Society of Artists. He made his mark in London's artistic circles, exhibiting topographical landscapes and subject pieces at the Royal Academy (1770–76), the Society of Arts (who awarded him a golden palette for his 'View of Brentford from Kew' in 1774), and the Society of Artists (1773–80), who elected him a fellow and director in 1777. In that year he submitted six landscapes to the exhibition in the great room at the Royal Exchange, Strand. Throughout this period Barralet continued to teach, establishing drawing-schools in James's St., Golden Square (1773), and St Alban's St., Pall Mall (1777).

BARRALET, John Melchior. brother of above. c1774-87 in London as a drawing master.

BARROW, T. Drawing Master. 15th Dec 1800 - Reading Mercury.

BARTHOLOMEW, Valentine

Little is known of Bartholomew's life: he was born on 18 January 1799, and married Hullmandel's daughter in 1827. He was for many years the Flower Painter in Ordinary firstly to the Duchess of Kent and later to Queen Victoria. A few of his exhibited

watercolour drawings are of landscape subjects including two views of Windsor (exh. Old Watercolour Society, 1836), and another of Eton (exh. RA, 1836). His views of Luxembourg and Heidelberg, indicate locations of his sketching trips abroad, one of which was with the landscape painter and lithographer J. D. Harding. Dying with chronic bronchitis and partial paralysis, his will stipulated that he was to be buried at Highgate cemetery in the grave of his second wife.

He taught Marianne North, and also Anna Maria Charretie. "Mrs. Charretie was born on the 5tlh of May, 1819, at Vauxhall. Her first effort in Art was in flower-painting, in which she was a pupil of Mr. Valentine Bartholomew; and she be came an amateur exhibitor at the Royal Academy when twenty years of age, in the first instance of flower-pieces, and subsequently of miniatures, in the painting of which she acquired considerable proficiency." [Obituary notice, The Art Journal, 1876]. The Royal Academy has three letters by Bartholomew, and there are two photographic portraits in the National Portrait Gallery.

BATTERSBY. Trade card of Mr Battersby, drawing master, at No.133, Bishopsgate Street without, London. c1770-1795.

BAYNES, James., 1766-1837.

Drawing master, a pupil of Romney, who, with frequent intervals, exhibited at the Royal Academy and in Suffolk Street from 1796 to 1837, and in all likelihood accompanied John Varley and George Arnald on sketching trips. BEATTIE, Miss. Drawing Mistress, 4 Northumberland Place, Edinburgh. Post Office Annual Directory, Edinburgh 1833-1834.

BEAUVAIS, Simon.

Mr. Beauvais, well-known at Tunbridge Wells for his Performance, begs leave to acquaint the Nobility and Gentry that he continues to paint Portraits in Water Colours, or India Ink, in which he has hitherto given general satisfaction as to the Likeness: he teaches also by a peculiar method, those of the least Capacity, to take off in a short time, a Likeness in Black Lead, or India ink, Miniature Pictures faithfully copied by him to any Size, and all kinds of Pictures, Prints, and Drawings, from the most Capital Masters, to be sold. To be spoke with at his Lodgings at Mr. Benoist's in St. Martin's Street, facing Long's Court, Leicester Field; every day from Eleven to One. [Advert in Public Advertiser, 1757].

BEAVERY, Thomas. drawing master. ?

BECKER, Ferdinand. fl c1770-1825. Bath. c1820 he was drawing master at Miss Lee's School, Belvedere House, Bath, twice a week during terms

BEENS, Mrs. Drawing teacher. 19 India St, Edinburgh. Post Office Annual Directory, Edinburgh 1833-1834.

BEILBY, William. See: GARDNOR, John., (born 1728 or 1729) who as the parish curate and doubtless seeking to supplement his income, issued a detailed prospectus for an academy for a maximum of thirty boys (boarders only) in his house at 13 Kensington Square, Battersea. Mathematics, geography, music, drawing and fencing were all offered; decorum was punctiliously observed at mealtimes, Gardnor told prospective parents, while 'the French Tongue is constantly spoken in the Family' – fees, £30 per year, or 40 guineas for 'Parlour Boarders'. After Gardnor took over as vicar in 1778, the academy was being run in partnership with the glass enameller and drawing master William Beilby.

BELL, John. (c.1793–1861), antiquary, collector, and landscape painter, was the second son of John Bell, gentleman landowner, of Camelon, near Falkirk, Scotland. From 1813 to his death he lived in various towns in Ulster, including Newry, Dungannon, Dundalk, and Armagh, but his geographical focus always remained in south Armagh. His principal income seems to have derived from teaching and painting. In 1839 he is recorded as the drawing master at the Royal School, Dungannon.

BELLINGHAM, John. Drawing Master, 1782. see DOSSIE p.408.

BERANGER, Gabriel., 1729-1817. Artist, and drawing master in Dublin.

BERRIDGE, John. (c.1742-1812)

In 1807 Joseph Farrington noted that he was "a drawing master, & teaches at 3 guineas a quarter." . Myrone, Martin. *A Biographical Dictionary of Royal Academy Students 1769-1830.* Walpole Society.

BEST, H.A. Drawing Master, 14 Morice-Square, Devonport. fl. 1840.

BIRD, Miss H. 25 Pitt Street, Edinburgh. Post Office Annual Directory, Edinburgh 1833-1834.

BISHOP. Drawing Master. 21st April 1846 - Liverpool Standard.

BISSE, Thomas. Drawing master at Christ's Hospital, the 'nondescript' man after Cozens resigned. Benjamin Green succeeded him. "After Cozens's resignation in 1754, there were only two applicants, perhaps because one, Jacob Bonneau, a Frenchman, had a testimonial signed by thiry-five of London's finest artists and other artists did not dare to compete. Thomas Bisse, an unknown, was his only competitor for the position. The Court Committee elected Bisse, by forty votes to fifteen, who discharged his duties to their satisfaction until his death in 1766 when Benjamin Green (c.1736-c.1800) was given the position and the rent of Bisse's house in Townditch at £10 per annum." ref: Kim Sloan.

BLACK, Miss Mary. Drawing Master to daughters of George III. 1780 taught Miss Egerton and Mrs Weddell. See: Sloan, Kim. The Noble Art, 2000.

BOLLINGS, Mr. Drawing Master. 28th June 1839 - Nottingham Review.

BONNEAU, Jacob.

1754 applied for post as Cozen's successor at Christ's Hospital.; see Dossie p.396; 1763 Private Teacher of Drawing, in King Street Soho (UD); 1767 taught Miss Claxton; 1767-8 taught George Grenvile at Stowe at 7s 10d per lesson plus materials (McCarthy p.32); 1782 living in Rathbone Place (Dossie p.396).

BONOMI, Joseph. (1796-1878) drawing master to Lady Kirkwall and her daughters.

BOOTY, Mr. Drawing Master. 15th Sept 1831 - Brighton Gazette.

BORGNIS, Joseph (c.1770-1842)

A drawing master based at High Holborn. Myrone, Martin. *A Biographical Dictionary of Royal Academy Students 1769-1830.* Walpole Society.

BORGNIS, Peter Maria (1743-1814)

A drawing master based in Titchfield Street, London. Myrone, Martin. *A Biographical Dictionary of Royal Academy Students 1769-1830.* Walpole Society.

BOSS, J. Drawing Master, Shrewsbury. 3rd July 1835 - Shrewsbury Chronicle

BOULGER, Thomas. 1769

Drawing Master in Dublin; 1788 taught in Portarlington.

BOULLAND, Monsieur. Drawing Master, Hull College. 14th July 1848 - Hull Advertiser.

BOYNE, John. 1781 ran an unsuccessful drawing school in Holborn and Gloucester Streets, Queen Square. 1788, drawing-master and engraver in Great Turnstile Street, Holborn.

BRANDOIN, Michael Vincent (Charles). fl.1768-72, Swiss who taught in England.

BREWER, John. 1795 to Derby where taught and kept a studio where he painted porcelain and landscapes.

BRIDPORT, Hugh. (1794-c1870)

Emigrated to America in 1816 and advertised a drawing academy.

BROCAS, Henry. from 1801 taught at Royal Dublin School. Relation of the Dublin printer John Brocas (fl 1703)?

BROOKE, Henry. Drawing master in Dublin and London; history and bible painter.

BROUGH, William. (1802-1873)

As 'Artist and Drawing Master of Southampton (Student of the Royal Academy, London), Brough advertised his availability for lessons in the vicinity of Southampton and Winchester.

BROWN, Benjamin. Mr Benjamin Brown, Writing and Drawing Master, 19. Cluster Place, Brighton. Schools and Private Families attended by the Quarter. 11th December 1833 - Brighton Guardian.

BROWN, drawing master, St. John's Lane, Halifax, returns his most grateful acknowledgments for the favours he has already received, and at the same time informs his friends and the public, that he hath opened an evening academy, for the instructions of such has have no an opportunity in the day. Single sheet. [Halifax, 1790?],

BROWNE, Alexander, (active 1659, died 1706), The Pestle and Mortar, Long Acre, and other London addresses as below. Miniaturist, drawing master, colourman, auctioneer, print publisher and printseller. Drawing master (to Samuel Pepys's wife among others).

"In the second edition of Ars Pictoria, 1675 (appendix, p.39), he advertised colours and other painting materials to be had from his lodgings and from the bookseller, Arthur Tooker (qv), stating that he had been collecting pigments over 16 years: 'Because it is very difficult to procure the Colours for Limning rightly prepared, of the best and briskest Colours, I have made it part of my business any time these 16 Years, to collect as many of them as were exceeding good, not onely here but beyond the Seas. And for those Colours that I could not meet with all to my mind, I have taken the care and pains to make them my self. Out of which Collection I have prepared a sufficient Quantity, not onely for my own use, but being resolved not to be Niggardly of the same, am willing to supply any Ingenious Persons that have occasion for the same at a reasonable rate, and all other Materials useful for Limning, which are to be had at my lodging in Long-acre, at the Sign of the Pestel and Mortar, an Apothecary's Shop; and at Mr. Tooker's Shop at the Sign of the Globe, over against Ivie Bridge in the Strand.' It has been suggested that this is probably the earliest extant advertisement for artists' colours in England (see Harley 1982 p.17)." Ref: British artists' suppliers, 1650-1950

BROWNE, Robert. 1749 - applicant for post of drawing master Christ's Hospital.

BUCK, Adam. 1795 arrived in London from Cork, successful teacher as was his son Sidney.

BUDD, George. c1750 taught drawing at Dr Newcome's School in Hackney.

BURGESS, H.W. (active 1809-1860), grandson of Thomas Burgess, drawing master to Thomas Gainsborough. He was appointed Landscape Painter to William IV in 1826, and was drawing master at Charterhouse from 1823-1840.

BURGESS, Thomas. (1721-1794)

He ran a drawing school in Maiden Lane. Myrone, Martin. *A Biographical Dictionary of Royal Academy Students 1769-1830.* Walpole Society.

BURGESS, [W]. Trade card of Mr Burgess, drawing master, at 46 Maiden lane, Covent Garden; text in oval. Engraving. 90mm x 64mm.

BUTCHER, Thomas. 'Engraver and drawing master from London lodges at Mrs Smith's Grocer in Abbey Green [Bath]... where he teaches drawing, etching, painting in watercolours, and painting on silk'.

CALLOW, John. (1822-1878). He was the younger brother and pupil of William Callow. William took him to Paris in 1835 where he took over his elder brother's drawing practice returning to England in 1844. He was a successful drawing master in London and was Professor at Queen's College, London.

CALVERT, Mr. Drawing master at the Mechanics' Institution, Manchester. 14th June 1833 - Liverpool Mercury.

CAMPION, George Bryant. A master at the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich. c1830

CARLYLE, Robert. Drawing Master in Carlisle.

CARR, Miss Barbara. Drawing teacher. 19 Hill St, Edinburgh. Post Office Annual Directory, Edinburgh 1833-1834.

CARROLL, John. Drawing master, Hammersmith Training College. fl1870-1890

John Carroll died in 1915, and at a requiem held in his honour, it was recorded that he held an "honoured place in the history of the College. Mr. John Carroll, as student at Hammersmith, headmaster at St. John's Wood, and art master at his Alma Mater for many years, with the interval since he left the College to continue his work in a wider sphere as one of the most successful art masters in London, covered a period of fifty years, and his name, his genial personality, and his good works will be a treasured memory to thousands in all parts of the country upon whom he has left the impress of his sterling character. With his devotion to art he had a love for his profession as a teacher, and his text books... remain in consequence a challenge to the best. The fine and spacious library of the College, which was originally intended as a large dining hall, is adorned with fine decorative panels filling the walls with copies of great masterpieces of religious art, a work of love in which Mr. Carroll has left an enduring mark of affection for the old College."

CARY, Francis. (1808-1880)

In 1842 he took on Sass's school, maintaining its place as the key training ground for prospective Academy students..." Myrone, Martin. *A Biographical Dictionary of Royal Academy Students 1769-1830.* Walpole Society, 2022.

CHAPLEY. Drawing Master, drawing master, 13 Chatham Row, Bath.

CLARKE, Richard. Drawing master at Portsmouth Naval Academy.

CLIFTON, W. Manuscript Notes from a Drawing Master's Portfolio. Part I and II. 1-8; 9-Reeves and Sons. c1880-1890.

CLIVE, Alan Butler. Drawing Master in Sussex.

COOKE, Ebenezer. (1837 - 1913). An apprenticed lithographic draughtsman, he was introduced by his brother Mordecai to the lectures of Frederick Denison Maurice at the Hall of Association, 34 Castle Street East, London, in 1853 and the summer of 1854. When the Working Men's College was formed in 1854, he attended John Ruskin's first drawing classes. After an unsuccessful partnership with John Fotheringham, also a student at the college, he gave up his trade and then took to teaching through the influence of Ruskin. He succeeded Ruskin as a drawing master at the college, and taught at other London establishments

COOKE, Robert. Drawing Master.

42 Bedford St, London 1785, 412 Strand, London 1786-1787, 4 Church St, Bath 1787, 402 Strand, London 1793, Gloucester and Gloucestershire 1795-1799, Bath before 1801, Norton St, Portland Road, London 1801, 31 Old Bond St, London 1804, possibly 12 Greek St, London 1812-1814, Upper John St, Fitzroy Square, London 1818. Drawing master, crayon and miniature painter.

COOPER, Daniel. (1749-1822) Drawing master at Bury School. Daniel Cooper, drawing master, of Eastgate-street, in this town, to Miss Amelia Darfield, late of Langham. Marriage notice. 13th Sept 1815 - Bury & Norwich Post.

COOPER, Richard, Junr. (1740-1822) Drawing master of landscapes in chalks to the Royal Princesses. Possibly succeeded or assisted Alexander Cozens at Eton.

CORDWELL. Drawing Master, Brighton. 10th Oct 1837 - Brighton Patriot

CORNISH, Mrs. "Ornamental Stationer, Cambray, Cheltenham. Lessons given by Mrs Cornish in imitation of Old India Japan, Inlaid Ebony & Ivory with every description of Fancy Wood. Drawings sold, or lent out to copy." Label in an album by Lady Vaughan, dated 1821.

COULES, R.T.C. Mr. T. C. Late DRAWING MASTER TO Her MAJESTY the QUEEN of

PORTUGAL, BRAZILIAN COTTAGE, NORTH MAIDENHEAD, BEGS to return sincere thanks to the Nobility, Gentry... for the distinguished patronage and liberal support which he has experienced.

1st Feb 1840 - Berkshire Chronicle

COX, David. In the summer of 1813 Cox was appointed as the drawing master of the Royal Military College in Farnham, Surrey, but he resigned shortly afterwards, finding little sympathy with the atmosphere of a military institution. Soon after that he applied to a newspaper advertisement for a position as drawing master for Miss Crouchers' School for Young Ladies in Hereford and in Autumn 1814 moved to the town with his family. Cox taught at the school in Widemarsh Street until 1819, his substantial salary of £100 per year requiring only two-day's work per week, allowing time for painting and the taking of private pupils.

COZENS, Alexander. Between 1750 and 1754, Cozens was drawing-master at Christ's Hospital, and in the same decade also began to take private pupils. He "succeeded Edward Lens as Drawing Master to Christ's Hospital on Edward's death in January, 1749. A John Lens, possibly Edward's son (b.1725) had also applied for the post but Cozens's strong self-advertisement had easily secured the position and prevented the continuation of the Lens monopoly. When Alexander Cozens applied for the position of Drawing Master to Christ's Hospital, four other artists had competed with him. £50 per year for three afternoons of teaching per week and the accompanying prestige were not scoffed at by the numerous artists trying to make a living by teaching and engraving, when portrait painters and foreign artists received a large proportion of the large commissions available and business was booming for dealers in old masters and fakes." From 1763 to 1768 he was drawing-master at Eton College. He gave lessons to the Prince of Wales, Sir George Beaumont, and William Beckford,

CRAIG, E.W., 5 Providence Row, Leeds 1794, Queens Square 1809. Drawing master and watercolour supplier.

Edwin William Craig (c.1777-1812), the son of James Craig, was christened on 30 July 1786 at St Peter, Leeds, but was born several years previously. He advertised in 1794 his school for drawing and fancy painting, as well as his watercolours, which had 'met the Approbation of some of the first Artists in the Metropolis... as superior in Brilliancy, and much more pleasant to Use than any others offered to the Public' (Leeds Intelligencer). Craig's trade card advertised 'Craig's Fine Prismatic and Compound Water Colours'.

James Craig was listed as a drawing master in Providence Row by 1800; he moved to premises in Queens Square and was joined by E.W. Craig by 1809. Edwin William Craig of Queens Square was buried, age 25, in 1812 at St John the Evangelist, Leeds.

DAGLEY, Richard. Dagley, educated at Christ's Hospital, also working in Doncaster.

Richard Dagley first came to public attention with the publication of a work entitled Gems Selected from the Antique, 1804, with plates designed and engraved by himself. However, although leading to further illustrative work, it was insufficient to earn him a living, and after a brief engagement as drawing-master in a lady's school in Doncaster, he returned to London in 1815. His Compendium written from his recent teaching experience, was almost certainly published to supplement the small income produced by reviewing books on art & illustration.

FABBRINI, Gaetano. A painter from Florence who also taught Italian, at the Royal Belfast Academical Institution. He taught Templeton, Robert (1802–92), naturalist and artist.

About 1832 he came to London and practiced as water-colour painter, and drawing master. His technique gave his paintings a particularly misty and foggy effect. After Queen Victoria's visit to Jersey in 1846, a volume of drawings by Le Capelain of scenery of the island was presented to her as an official souvenir, and this led to his receiving a commission from the Queen to paint pictures of the Isle of Wight. While engaged on these he developed tuberculosis, of which he died in Jersey in 1848. [ref: Ken Spelman].

The most famous of the London art-schools was Sass's. This was regarded as an elite institution which set out to prepare (male) students for The Royal Academy just as Eton prepared its pupils for entry into Oxbridge. Set up by Henry Sass (1788–1844) in 1813, it moved in 1820 to No. 6, Charlotte Street, Bloomsbury. It was the first school to teach its students in any methodical way, and it occupies an important place in the development of Victorian art. Its list of alumni is certainly impressive. These premises were attended by Millais, Cope, Frith, Corbould and Deverell. Under the management of Stephen Cary (changing its name in 1842 to Cary's), the school also trained Rossetti, Edward Lear, Simeon and Abraham Solomon, Henry Wallis and Braithwaite Martineau.

He appears to have moved in 1802 into his son's premises at 4 Green Park and then 3 Westgate Buildings. Late in 1824 he moved to Clifton, Bristol, to a relation's house at 1a Clifton Place, and died there early in 1825.

His son John Arnold Sanders, born probably before 1789 in London, who had a drawing academy at 4 Green Park, Bath in 1802; offered landscape and perspective at 19 Kingsmead Street in Bath and 1 Clifton Place, Bristol in 1815; and married Fanny Hippisley at Shepton Mallet on 21 October 1815. He taught drawing at the Bristol Hotwell in 1816 and possibly later, but is said to have got involved with a pupil. He emigrated to Canada in 1832-33.

The opening was in the event delayed, but in June he solicited 'the Presence of the Artists, and Lovers of the Science, from Ten till Three o'clock every Day, Except Saturday. . . 'On these lines Stevenson continued to advertise for many years, but with developments. In 1784 he instituted exhibitions of his pupils' work. In 1787, having been taken into partnership by J. Crouse, bookseller and printer of the Norfolk Chronicle, he extended the stationery business to take in artists' materials and then prints and drawings. He became the local agent for Reeves' watercolours and could supply colours in cakes, liquid colours in bottles, bistre, Indian ink, crayon pencils, carmine, Chinese vermilion, black lead pencils, brushes, drop and shell colours, chalks, drawing papers, leather and India rubbers, glasses for grinding, and other materials. He accepted a restricted number of pupils up to the very end of the century. In January 1800 they could still be taught privately or attend his drawing academy (then in Surrey Street): 'Such Ladies and Gentlemen as wish to learn the rudiments of Perspective, he respectfully proposes to instruct with an Apparatus which explains, in the easiest manner, that most essential part of Drawing."
